Prerequisite Course Guidelines for the 2024-2025 Application Cycle

Applicants must earn a C or higher in all required prerequisite coursework. The Admissions Committee reserves the right to request course descriptions for any course which any applicant chooses to use for a prerequisite course requirement. Labs are preferred but not required in the science prerequisite courses.

| Biochemistry | 3 | Introductory-level biochemistry courses will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. We will not accept Organic Chemistry in lieu of Biochemistry. |
| Additional Upper- Level Biology | 6 | Recommendations include: genetics, cell biology, molecular biology, embryology, histology, and/or immunology. Courses that are 200-level or higher are preferred. Courses should not be introductory-level. |
| English Composition | 3 | We will accept other courses that have a writing intensive component. AP credit is acceptable. |
| General Psychology | 3 | We will not accept upper-level psychology courses in lieu of general and/or introductory psychology, unless the applicant had an undergraduate psychology major. AP credit is acceptable. |
| Statistics | 3 | Preferred: applied statistics or biostatistics from a psychology, biology, or math department. AP credit is acceptable. |
