

**Prerequisite Course Guidelines for the 2020-2021 Application Cycle** The

Admissions Committee reserves the right to request course descriptions for any course which any applicant chooses to use for a prerequisite course requirement.

Labs are preferred but not required in the science prerequisite courses.

<b>Course</b>	<b>Minimum Number of credits</b>	<b>Notes</b>
Human Anatomy	3	Combined Anatomy and Physiology courses are acceptable provided the total amount of credits is a minimum of 6.
Physiology	3	Combined Anatomy and Physiology courses are acceptable provided the total amount of credits is a minimum of 6.
Microbiology	3	
Biochemistry	3	Introductory-level biochemistry courses will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.  We will not accept Organic Chemistry in lieu of Biochemistry.
Additional upper level biology	6	Recommendations include: genetics, cell biology, molecular biology, embryology, histology, and/or immunology.  Courses that are 200-level or higher are preferred. Courses should not be introductory-level.
Statistics	3	Preferred: applied statistics or biostatistics from a psychology, biology, or math department.
English Composition	3	We will accept other courses that have a writing-intensive component.
General Psychology	3	We will not accept upper level psychology courses in lieu of general and/or introductory psychology, unless the applicant had an undergraduate psychology major.
